Haiti Disaster: The people of Haiti suffered a humanitarian disaster last week as hurricane Andrew ripped through the island, destroying buildings, leaving 900 people dead and thousands homeless and hungry. This is the second time in a few years that Haiti has been struck a severe blow from a natural disaster having previously been wrecked by an earthquake. Some parishioners have asked that we as a parish community be given an opportunity to give some aid to the people of Haiti in their time of need. To meet this request we will have a bucket collection in the Church grounds on **Saturday, 22nd & Sunday 23rd Oct. in both Clarecastle & Ballyea as people leave Mass.** This gives people a very definite place and opportunity to contribute to the Haiti fund. The monies collected will be forwarded to Trócaire for the assistance of the people in Haiti. Anyone who wishes to make a contribution to it is welcome to do so.

McCarthy Brothers: The funeral of brothers William and Daniel McCarthy was held in Dingle, Co. Kerry during the week. The circumstances of the deaths of William and Daniel are so sad and a call to all of us in this community to look out for our neighbours. The best way to ensure that the vulnerable, the sick or those who are isolated are cared for is where the local community look out for them. As we pray, eternal rest to Daniel and William McCarthy, let each one of us make a conscious decision to look out for our neighbours, especially the elderly and vulnerable. The haunting question for each of us is could what happened in the Dublin community happen in our parish? If we think it could, what can we do to make sure it does not happen.
