Ash Wednesday: Wednesday 18th February is Ash Wednesday. It is the beginning of Lent, a time for reflection, Repentance & Renewal. The weeks of Lent give us a time to prepare for the celebration of the Great Christian Feast of Easter. Lent begins liturgically with the blessing of Ashes which we wear on our foreheads as a sign of our need and desire for Repentance. Ashes will be blessed at the 10am mass in Clarecastle on Wednesday next and at the 7pm Mass in Ballyea on the same day. There will be an evening mass in Clarecastle on Wednesday evening also at 7pm.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence, one of two such days during the Lenten Season, the Second being Good Friday. People obviously are free to fast on other days in

Lent if they so wish. The obligation to fast and abstain on the two days in Lent is for all between the ages of 18 to 59 who are in good health. Those who have medical conditions between these ages that fasting would not help them medically have no obligation to fast. The obligation to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday falls to all from the age of 14 years onwards, though families may decide to adopt it for younger family members.

Lenten Masses: There will be an evening mass in Ballyea Church on the Fridays of Lent. That mass will be at 7.00pm.
