We know too the joy and hope and indeed energy that is brought into our day as we see the heroic work of medics and carers, and all on the front line caring for the sick and providing for our essential needs. We see the source of loving care and concern expressed in community ventures of help and supportive gestures expressed so generously by so many. As we celebrate Holy Week 2020, may we bring our experiences of struggle, apparent helplessness with us into the celebration of Easter this year. Reflecting on them and praying with them, may we experience then the joy and the hope and the assurance of success that Jesus offers us through his suffering death and resurrection. On Easter morning may we rejoice in the resurrection with a newly found and firmly grounded hope, based on our faith, that we too will rise from and above the present epidemic and we will thrive again. For Jesus teaches us that Good Friday is always Followed by EASTER SUNDAY. With this knowledge and confidence may we be able to sing Alleluia – we rejoice and are glad, our God journeys with us and will see us through.
