# We Remember Them:

This week my thoughts are with the families who have experienced bereavements during this Covid-19 time. The death of a loved one is a very traumatic, emotional and upsetting time whenever that happens. However, it strikes me that the death of a loved one during our present crisis is even more so. All the traditional supports of neighbours, families, work-mates gathering have been removed. Members of families may not be able to meet each other, except briefly at the funeral, certainly no hugs, no meals afterwards, and of course the absence of closest friends on days like this, add to the sense of loss and grief. Even the church, if it happens at all, is different – ten people to attend, while understandable, it is difficult to endure.

For those families where their loved one died of covid the grief is acute. Listening nationally to the numbers of people dying each day of covid related illnesses, we must not just hear numbers. Each number represents a person's life/death journey, each number tells a story, each number is a statistic in the fight of a disease, but each number is a person, who touches the lives and hearts of many. A person who can never be replaced, whose leaving our world even to go to God, leaves a huge vacuum in the world of so many and in the communities too. The stark reality is, that number could be you or me.

This weekend I want to remember all who have died through non-covid or covid related illnesses at this time. I will remember them in mass on Tuesday morning at 10am. If relatives or families wish to send me in the names of their loved ones who died at this time, dropping it in the letter box of the parochial house or calling the parish office on 065-6823011 to leave their name, I will remember them at mass. For it is only right that we remember them.

For the considerable future it is important too that we keep in touch with the bereaved, by phone, letter etc and so assure them of our support, care and prayers at this time.

It is important that they know that not only do we remember their deceased loved ones, we remember them too.
