## **Christmas Schedule**

This year has brought its own challenges and demanded responses no one ever dreamt they would have to take. The same is true of our parish and we thank you all for your understanding of decisions made and implemented even if they were not ones you liked yourself.

In relation to our celebration of Christmas this year, we have a number of adjustments to our Christmas schedule. Last week we outlined the Parish Decision with regard to church services, masses & liturgy around the Crib on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. These ceremonies will take place behind closed doors and will be broadcast on the parish radio and parish webcam - https://www.clarecastleballyeaparish.ie/our-parish/webcam/. We have a schedule of masses each day this week Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in Ballyea and Clarecastle and we invite our parishioners who wish to attend mass in person for Christmas to choose one of these masses and this will suffice for attendance at Christmas mass. These masses will be masses of Christmas Eve and Day. People are perfectly free to join on the parish webcam or radio for all masses or listen on the national/local radio or watch RTE Mass. There is no obligation to attend in person.

The churches will remain open for private prayer. Clarecastle: Sundays and Christmas Day 1 p.m.-5 p.m., Christmas Eve 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. and all other days 10 a.m. – 5 p.m. Ballyea: Open daily 10 a.m.-5 p.m.

This year conscious that we are living in very difficult times the Pastoral Councils have erected a nativity scene outside our churches. These scenes enable people to visit the outside Nativity and pray there, without having to go into the church if they so wish. The traditional Crib in Clarecastle will not be on display this year, instead a much smaller crib will be placed in front of the altar. The crib usually attracts people to it and many touch it so we do not have the traditional beautiful crib on display this year. The smaller pieces of this year's Crib come with the distinction that they were made in Bethlehem and brought home from the place where Jesus was born, in that way they are very special, and unite us in a very real way with the craft of Joseph the carpenter who offered safety and security on that first Christmas Night in Bethlehem.

We wish all our parishioners every blessing this Christmas and may we continue to be one community united in prayer and celebration together, from a safe distance, this Christmas.
