<u>Ash Wednesday:</u> Wednesday next is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Season of Lent. Lent is time of penance, prayer and renewal. We are encouraged during the season of Lent to engage in some practices of fasting, almsgiving, penance and works of mercy. There are now only two obligatory days of Fast and Abstinence in the Season of Lent – Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days all in good health between the ages of 18 - 60 are asked to abstain from eating meat and to engage in fasting by eating one meal and two collations. We are encouraged to fast on other days in Lent of our own choosing.

Lent is a time of prayer also, and we are encouraged to make some moments for prayer a feature of our day. Maybe we could take on the challenge of setting aside each day a short period of family or personal prayer. Asking God to be with us in our journey through life.

Lent traditionally is a time we can focus on the corporal works of mercy and acts of Christian giving to those who are less fortunate than ourselves, both at home and in Third World Countries. To this and Trocaire each year organise an annual collection to aid the workings of the Irish Church in the mission fields. We thank all of you for your contributions to Trocaire over the years. This years Trocaire Campaign is to aid the people of Sudan. This year there are Trocaire boxes and packs available in the Churches of the parish for anyone who wishes to pick one up. Contributions can be dropped into the Parish Office, Parochial House at anytime during Lent and over the Easter period and we will forward them to Trocaire.

Mass on Wednesday for Ash Wednesday will be at 10.00am. Ashes will be blessed at the 10.00am mass on Wednesday.
